This fact sheet is one in a series of summaries about hazardous substances and their health effects. This information is important because this substance may harm you. The effects of exposure to any hazardous substance depend on the dose, the duration, how you are exposed, personal traits and habits, and whether other chemicals are present.

HIGHLIGHTS: Benzene is a widely used chemical formed from both natural processes and human activities. Breathing benzene can cause drowsiness, dizziness, and unconsciousness; longterm benzene exposure causes effects on the bone



The Solution: Cleanup Process & Progress



Cleanup Activities At This Site

There are many stages of cleanup, including site study, remedy selection, remedy design, remedy construction, and post-construction. Activities undertaken early in the cleanup process focus on understanding problems at the site while those taken later in the cleanup process focus on physically addressing those problems identified.


Many NPL sites are large and complicated. These sites are often broken up into smaller areas to make cleanup easier and more manageable. These areas are called "Operable Units" or OUs (see glossary).

The chart below shows the different types of activities that are underway or complete at each of the cleanup areas (operable units) at the site. Some activities apply to the entire site, EPA assigns these activities to the site-wide operable unit (designated as OU 0).








Geographic Regions

- Filter your search results, not just zoom
- Use predefined regions, or create your own
 - EPA Regions, USGS Hydrologic regions, and common geographic regions (e.g., "Midwest")
- Save, edit, and restore your regions
 - Requires keeping your "RegionID"
- Saved in list of places ("Zoom to a place")
- Enables release summaries of all chemicals or of a selected chemical

Advanced Search

- Filters data based on more criteria than region, chemical name, and year
- Accessed via Search Tab
 - or Quick Search "More Search Options..."
- Auto-zooms map to search results
- Works independently of geographic region
- User interface recently re-designed

Linking to TOXMAP

"MapIt"

- Used by TOXNET/TRI
- Specify city, state, ZIP, chemical name/RN, TRI submission numbers, RegionID, "other place," or nothing at all
- Specify TRI, Superfund, or both via URL
- See FAQ for details
- Links to facility details and releases summary tables
 - Undocumented other than mention in FAQ

GIS Notes

- Built with ArcIMS 4.x, now using 9.1
- Windows, Apache w/mod_jk, Tomcat
- ESRI JavaConnector API
 - originally MapBeans
- Migrating to ArcIMS 9.2 (Q207)
 - first, software update
 - later, new 9.2 features
 - then, investigate ArcGIS Server


GIS Architecture

- No ArcSDE
 - No \$\$\$ for Oracle or SQL Server license
- Data in shapefile or MySQL database
 - 680 MB
- Construct maps via
 - hide/show shapefile layers
 - MySQL query, then acetate layer
 - SpatialFilter on shapefile layer
 - truncate acetate-based queries at 5,000

One mortality layer dynamically updated


